# SPIN-D Network+ Collaboration with the Lewisham Youth Brain Health Project

Seeking to empower young people as advocates for dementia prevention, the Youth Involvement and Engagement Lab, the Lewisham Young Mayor and Young Advisors Team, and SPIN-D Network+ jointly secured funding from Alzheimer's Research UK's Inspire Fund to deliver the Lewisham Youth Brain Health Project — a six-month pilot aimed at raising awareness of brain health and dementia prevention across the South East London borough.

### Flexible Funding Announcement

SPIN-D is pleased to announce the <u>first round of</u>
<u>projects awarded</u> through the Flexible Funding initiative for Early
Career Researchers.

Applications were reviewed and selected by a panel of SPIN-D members, including co-leads, strategic partners, and representatives from our core lived experience group.

In total, eleven projects received funding across two schemes: *Inclusion in Practice* and *Proof of Principle*.
